Bass Lake County Park

Located off of Minnesota State Aid Hwy 1, eleven miles east of Effie or eleven miles west of Togo, Minnesota. Bass Lake Park is interlaced with many trails within its 663-acre boundary. Park System personnel minimally maintain the trails which are open to multiple uses that include hikers, bikers, and equestrian use.

Cutfoot Sioux Horse Campground 218-246-2123

Located 19 miles north of Deer River on Hwy 46. Turn NW on FR 2171 (3.2 miles past the Cut Foot Sioux Visitor Center). Travel approx. two miles in on FR 2171. Campground entrance is located on the west side of the road. Visitors are asked to stay on designated trails and use nose bags for feed. Certified weed-free hay is strongly recommended to prevent the spread of non-native plant species.

Located 19 miles north of Deer River on Hwy 46. Turn West on FR 2190 (½ mile past the Cut Foot Sioux Visitor Center). For more info, call the Deer River Ranger Station at 218-246-2123.

Simpson Creek Recreation

20 mile trail. Located from Deer River, 18 miles NW on Hwy 46. Start at Cut Foot Sioux Visitor Center. Access also from Eagle Nest Resort. Trail runs through forest of old growth pines with many lakes, all in non- motorized area. Maps along trail.

Stoney Ridge Trail

4.6 mile trail. Located 20 miles North of Nashwauk along Hwy 65. Trail is located in the George Washington State Forest. Three loops traverse the rugged terrain offering beginning and intermediate skiing. Sherry Lake can be found at the very end of the last loop.

21 mile trail. Located about 9 miles South of Marcell (or 14 mi North of Grand Rapids) off State Hwy 38, along the "Edge of the Wilderness" National Scenic Byway. Trail runs through rolling hills and lakes, with maple, basswood, and aspen forest. Maps along trail.

Wabana Trail

6 mile trail. Located 14 miles NE of Grand Rapids on Cty Rd 59. Trail offers five loops to choose from within a mixed forest and wildflower sanctuary. The river loop follows the Wabana Creek. Clearwater Lake lies South of the trail system. Wabana Trail is one of two designated county wildflower sanctuaries.
